Construction

Construction is kiln dried lumber*, glued and screwed together, sealed with a Water Sealer/Stain. Lid has 2 hinges on back with latch on front of box.
*Only exception is the bottom runner which comes in contact with the ground is a Pressure Treated 2" X 4" and the lid is 2" X 6" Douglas fir.

Custom sizes for Goats, Alpacas & Llamas Heavy duty if needed or for draft horse.


